Introduction



Strengths

- Virtual distinguished lectures have been a huge success.
- Educational events organized by the technical panels (e.g. Radar Summer School RSP).

Weaknesses

- Resource center and IEEE Learning Network usage.

Opportunities

- Capitalize on experience gained organizing online educational events.
- Capitalize on experience gained organizing educational events (e.g. RSS & Radar Challenge RSP).

► Threats

- Deterioration of in-person events.
- Necessity to change educational offerings in order to meet current demands.





Online Educational Resources



Main Activities – Online Educational Resources



IEEE Learning Network (ILN)

- AESS Resource Center has not been highly used by AESS members.
- ► ILN is an IEEE-wide platform for offering educational resources.
- Material from the resource center is being transitioned to ILN. Progress was slow last year but the transition is now almost complete.
- How an we encourage contributions to ILN?
- How can we increase the offerings in ILN and the usage of ILN?

Near-term strategy:

- Transition all existing educational videos to ILN.
- Continue to add virtual distinguished lectures to ILN.
- Add Radar Summer School videos to ILN.
- Obtain more resources from virtual conferences.



Main Activities – Online Educational Resources



Webinar Series (new initiative)

- Virtual distinguished lectures have been incredibly successful and have highlighted the demand for online educational resources.
- How can we expand online educational resources beyond the distinguished lectures?

Idea:

Launch a series of webinars in addition to the virtual DLs.

Topical Webinar

30 minute webinar with very broad general interest

Technical Webinar

1 hour technical webinar

Distinguished lecture for non-DLs

Near-term strategy:

- ► Launch an initial series of 6 prerecorded topical webinar videos.
- Starting at a suitable time in 2022.



Main Activities – Online Educational Resources



Advertising ILN (new initiative)

- Virtual distinguished lectures have highlighted the demand for online educational resources, however, the resource center had very low usage.
- How can we raise awareness of the online resources?

Idea:

- Use short max. 2 minute teaser videos to advertise the resources being added to ILN.
- Each webinar and virtual DL should have an associated 2 minute teaser video.
- Videos are prerecorded by the speaker and only reviewed by us.

Near-term Strategy:

- Invite speakers for new webinars initiative and virtual DLs to contribute a teaser video.
- Publish videos using existing social media channels.
- Use more standard advertising (e.g. website, one paper for the magazine, flyer for conferences,...).





Distinguished Lecturer Program



Main Activities – Distinguished Lecturer Program



Distinguished Lecturer Program

- Lower number of in-person distinguished lectures during Covid times.
- Virtual Distinguished Lecturer Program
 - 44 virtual lectures in 2020 and 2021.
 - Attendance has been very good.

Near-term Strategy:

- Continue running DL program as usual. Call for new lecturers end of 2022.
- Add the requirement that a lecturer must give a least one virtual lecture during their tenure.
- Invite lecturers to contribute a 2 minute teaser video.
- Invite the chapters to host virtual DLs.
- One 2022 series of virtual DLs to be held at regular intervals over the year.





Educational Events



Main Activities – Educational Events



Facilitate new Summer School events (new initiative)

- ▶ Radar summer school has established itself over last 5 years, with an attendance regularly between 60 100.
- ► Two days of lectures and demonstrations given by international experts aimed at new members of the community. Often combined with a YP event.
- GlueTech organized an online summer school in 2021.
- Can this success be transitioned to other AESS areas?

Near-term strategy:

- Reach out to technical panels and conferences regarding new summer schools.
- Provide best practices, process for AESS funding, and contact for a mentor.
- Potentially in the future: expand to challenge events.





Awards



Main Activities - Awards



IEEE AESS Robert T. Hill Best Dissertation Award

- Nine candidates in 2021.
- First judging round reduced the number of candidates to 3. Final round selected the winner.
- Winner: Joe Khalife

Near term strategy:

► Maintain a high number of entries → publicity.



Main Activities - Awards



IEEE AESS Michael C. Wicks Radar Student Travel Grant

- Awarded for the first time in 2022 in conjunction with the IEEE Radar Conference 2022.
- ► All AESS student members presenting a paper were automatically considered.
- 17 candidates from Europe and the USA
- Three recipients receiving hotel accommodation, conference registration, tutorials and RSS.

Lessons learned:

- No candidates from outside Europe and the USA. Because of Covid? Or AESS student membership?
- Paper quality rating was difficult to determine quickly.
 - Use the rating from the paper review process.
- Decision should ideally be made faster.

Near term goal: Improve process in future years leading to 1) Faster decision, 2) Recipients from low GDP per capita PPP countries.

AESS Scholarship Program



- AES Scholarship Program initiated in 2017 for award in 2018
 - Graduate level in Systems Engineering (1)
 - SE specified to attract more students to this important discipline
 - Undergraduate level in electronics/computer engineering (1)
 - Systems Engineering not generally offered as undergraduate degree program
 - Initially \$5,000 each but increased to \$10,000 in 2021
 - \$5,000 not considered adequate in today's expensive college environment
- Interest has been high-typically 10 to 12 applicants
- Program administered by Bob Rassa, Kathleen Kramer, and Hugh Griffiths
 - 2022 program evaluations will start shortly and be announced by April 30
 - 2023 applications will be accepted as of Sept 1, 2022
