

Major Threats To AES Conference Revenue

- AIAA/DATC and ION Have Continued To Complain About Lack Of AES Participation In Financially Sponsored Conferences
- Iram Weinstein and Bob Rassa Tried To Negotiate with DATC
 - DATC Still Demands Part Of Xplore Revenue Flow
 - Unilateral Signing Of 2016 ICNS and 2017 DASC Contracts
 - 2016 DASC Has Significantly More Participation By AES
- ION Has Not Seen "any" AES Participation Since 2010
 - We Need to Step Up or Move to TCS status
 - Lisa Beaty Came To POCO to understand IEEE Policies, and is convinced "she does not need the headaches"
- New IEEE MOU Process Greatly Complicates The Negotiation
 - Boilerplate and Non-binding Caveates

AES Board of Governors Needs To Decide If We Are Going To Engage Long Term, or Change The Way We Collaborate



PLANS/ISISS Merger Status (May BoG) updated with ION Inputs

- The Chair of the PLANS executive committee, Phil Dugandzic, reached out to a couple of his colleagues ...serving on the ISISS organizing committee.
- Apparently the ISISS conference grew out of meetings that were sponsored by Andrei Shkel (UC Irvine) when he was managing an advanced inertial sensors program at DARPA.
- The participants wanted an annual public conference where folks (especially the academics) could publish their research.
 - The first conference (held this past February)
 - It was so successful that they are greatly expanding the conference for the second offering this coming March.
- One of the merger concerns that has been raised already has to do with the fact that ISISS is planning to hold its conference annually, whereas PLANS is biennial.
 - ION Says ISISS is a threat to their business plan (another IEEE interface!)
- A telecom was held on 2 April -- If we wanted to allow for some collaboration, we could:
 - We begin the process of cross-fertilization. Highly publicize each conference at the other.
 - We could move PLANS to an annual conference, to co-host them in the same venue, showing the separate topics. (See other ION issues)



Technically Co-sponsored Conferences

- Beginning In 2016, IEEE Rules Have Changed
 - If 0% IEEE Financial Interest, IEEE Technical Cosponsors Will Be Charged \$1000 +\$15/Paper Sent To Xplore
 - If The Sponsoring IEEE OU Desires, It Can Ask MCE To Bill The Conference For Some Or All Of This Cost
 - Choice Can Differ Between Conferences
 - All Revenue Collected By MCE From External Conferences Will Be Given To The Sponsoring IEEE OU
 - If Multiple IEEE Entities Are TCS The Fee And Revenues Would Be Split
 - If An IEEE Entity Is A Financial Sponsor, The TCS Fee Will Not Be Charged
- AES Bog Needs A Strategy On How To Implement These
 New Policies Recommendation Provided Below

Disposition Of Xplore TCS Paper Charges

- 2016 EuRAD MOU says TCS Paper Fee Divided Equally Between AES, MTT and APS
- 2016 ESA EMC EMCS Agreed To take 3% Finance Sponsor in lieu of TCS Paper Charges
- 2016 ESA TTC AES Agreed To Pay Paper Charges
- 2016 FUSION ISIF would like AES 3% Finance Sponsor
- Need to have policy on St Petersburg ICINS, and European Navigation Conferences

Have AES and other OUs split costs	 Removes other Entities from demanding revenue Helps with strategic new Conferences e.g. ESA 	 Funding cost for first few years, until Xplore downloads
Establish AES as nominal Financial Sponsor	 Eliminates the \$1000 + \$15/paper costs Potential For Increased attendance – If AES steps up 	 Some Entities Consider IEEE bureaucracy a Major burden

Summary And Actions

- AES BoG Has Changed Significantly
 - Do we still want to support Digital Avionics (AIAA) and Integrated Navigation (ION)
- IEEE ICX "automation" has made it increasingly difficult to set up and manage conferences
 - Lag in MOU process
 - MOU wording is "non-binding"
- TCS Policy Changes has taken our historic alliances by surprise
 - This will be a major drain on AES budget if not addressed

Action: Establish Small Committee to address strategy on staffing conference committees and TCS policies

Impact of New TCS Rules

- TCS Fees based on current year uploads
 - Roughly offsets
 "Indirect Content"
 Credit of \$18K+
- Revenues from past years are substantial
- New TCS commitments will run at a loss until 3-5 year tail is created
- Policy agreement with TCS partners needed
